From Dr Feelgood and Eddie & the Hot Rods, Alison Moyet and Depeche Mode, My Life Story, Menswear, Blur, right up to Get Cape, Wear Cape, Fly, Scroobius Pip and The Horrors, Essex has always had a rich music scene. Local music fanzine *Noisy* pays tribute to the county's musical heritage and talented individuals who have documented the scene past and present in a small exhibition running alongside a live music event showcasing four punk bands from the Southend area.

Giacomino C. Parkinson has been taking pictures of Southend bands and gigs since 1982 - his pictures include well-known Essex musicians including Dr. Feelgood and Billy Bragg, as well as shots of current acts including Ten Tigers and The Machines.
